

Law Enforcement Agency Information



Thank you for your department's interest in our available dogs. All dogs listed on this website have been eliminated from our training program; however, if given enough time and attention, many will make outstanding patrol and detection dogs. You will note that some of our dogs have extensive training while others have very little. However, all of them will require additional training in order to successfully serve as police dogs in your department.

In order for your department to obtain one of our dogs, we require a Letter of Request (a sample letter is on our main page) on city/county/department letterhead from the senior leadership that states the number of dogs you are looking to obtain, the type of dog you are looking for, the capabilities you are looking for in a dog, the environment you will be working the dog in and who the point of contact (name, phone #, email if available) will be. This letter must be received by us prior to scheduling an appointment. Appointments will be scheduled during the week, Monday - Thursday between 8am- 1pm. Appointments are on a first come, first serve basis. We ask that you plan on spending the night on the day of your appointment. This will enable us to get the dog ready for transfer and provide the veterinary clinic sufficient time to schedule and conduct the departure physical. Upon arrival we will ask for identification (badge or other department credentials) and you will be shown a list of available dogs. Police Officers or designated representatives will be allowed access to the dogs in order to evaluate their temperament and suitability to serve as a police dog. Representatives must bring all necessary equipment required to evaluate the dog(s). Equipment will not be furnished for evaluations. Once a dog has been selected, a departure physical will be conducted. If the dog is transferred, a copy of the medical paperwork will be provided and the individual representing the Police Department will be asked to sign a form releasing the dog from the government and over to the **department**. Please bring a collar and leash with you. Thank you for your interest in our program.
