Finally, we received some good news that the Child Development Center project for Lackland will be moving forward in FY22. This increased capacity, while still a few years away, will bring some much-needed relief in terms of reducing our waiting list, providing more flexible care options for non-traditional shift workers and will reduce out-of-pocket expenses. Today, during our E-6 and below Command team call we spent some time talking about where to find information regarding all things childcare in terms of waiting list information, how to find family childcare providers and how to receive subsidies for out-of-pocket expenses. The FSP is a cornerstone of security cooperation efforts between the US and Partner Nations; this key element of the Academy's curriculum instills cross-cultural understanding and reinforces strategic alliances.

- 344th TRS hosting 2021 AF Contracting Superintendent Symposium this week: Senior enlisted leaders, MAJCOM chief and career field managers from across the Air Force will be attending. Symposium topics include superintendent responsibilities, acquisition professional development program management, expeditionary ops and more. 

24 July 1950: With large numbers of recruits arriving at Lackland in the wake of the Korean War, the 3700th Air Force Indoctrination Wing replaced its 13-week basic military training program with a 40 day training program (based on a six day work week). This effectively cut BMT in half!
