**Dec. 10, 1950:** The 3650th Air Force Indoctrination Wing is established at Sampson AFB, New York; the former U.S. Navy installation was used by the Air Force to expand basic training in the wake of the start of the Korean War and the extremely overcrowded situation on Lackland.
