

Before a general court-martial which convened at Albrook Field, Canal Zone, pursuant to paragraph 13, Special Orders No. 276, Headquarters Panama Canal Department, November 30, 1932, as modified by paragraph 3, Special Orders No. 58, Headquarters Panama Canal Department, March 13, 1933, was arraigned and tried:

1. Attached hereto chart from Recording Complaint Meter attached to Lieut. Crane's gas system, Saturday June 3rd and taken off Saturday June 10th.

2. During first two days of test the hot water heater was cut off. Chart shows 255 cubic feet used during these first two days. This figure subtracted from the total of 1775 and divided by 5 gives the daily average consumption of 304 cubic feet of gas. The daily allowance is 265 cubic feet.

3. Approximately two weeks ago the cut off valve leading to hot water heater was closed about 70° thereby reducing flow of gas. Prior to the above time this valve was fully opened.

4. Of ten meters tested on this post in May 1933 the average error was found to be:

This office is informed by the Gas Company that it is standard practice to disregard meter errors that do not exceed 2%.
