





Officers wives clubs donate to AF villages

The delegates attended a questionand-answer session Oct. 18 with foundation president retired Col. Richard Hagauer. "I've had 14 annual meetings with delegates, but this one was the best by far," he said.

The delegates presented their pledges and donations to Ellie McPeak, wife of Gen. Merrill McPeak, former Air Force Chief of Staff, Oct. 20. Ellie is also a member of the Foundation Board and is the senior lady of the OWCs.

The official end of the annual meeting was a black-tie dinner hosted by Foundation Chairperson retired Maj. Gen. Gerald Cooke. The guest speaker was Lt. Gen. Billy Boles, deputy chief of staff for personnel.

Also at the dinner the total amount of donations and pledges was announced. "Friday night was the climax of our entire week," Wennermark said.

The Menger Hotel

The original two-story, fifty room hotel was built in 1859 by German immigrants, William and Mary Kenger. Its first architect, John Fries, is also credited with repairing the shattered ruin of the Alamo in 1850. D'arious improvements have been made over the years adding such luxuries as electric lights and a steam elevator as early as 1887. Extensive changes were made in 1909 such as the addition of marble flooring and Denaissance-revival style details, including Corinthian columns and filigreed balustrades to the original lobby. The leaded skylight was also added at this time. Many pieces of furniture in this lobby and throughout the Kenger are believed to have been purchased by William Kenger on his frequent buying trips to New York and Europe in the 1860's.

The bar, built in 1887, is a replica of the House of Lords Rub in London complete with a paneled ceiling of cherrywood and booths and belevled mirrors from France. It still features the original brass spittoons for tobacco chewing and snuff dipping. During Rrohibition it was disassembled but later reconstructed in its present location. It was in this bar that Teddy Loosevelt recruited many of his Lough Liders.


We will be open only Wednesdays starting 7 June until August. We will, however, be open on the first Saturdays of July and August.
