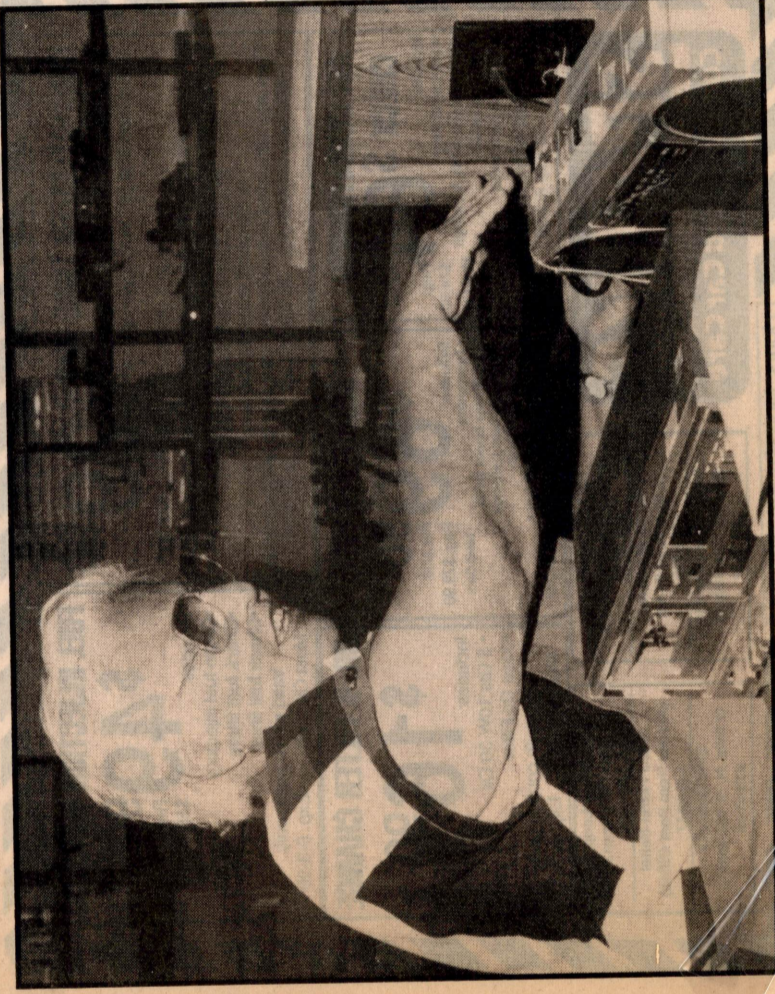

Base tops million \$\$ CFC mark Officers wives donate to local youth, families

In addition to the key workers' efforts, at least one Lackland private organization helped support two United Way organizations during

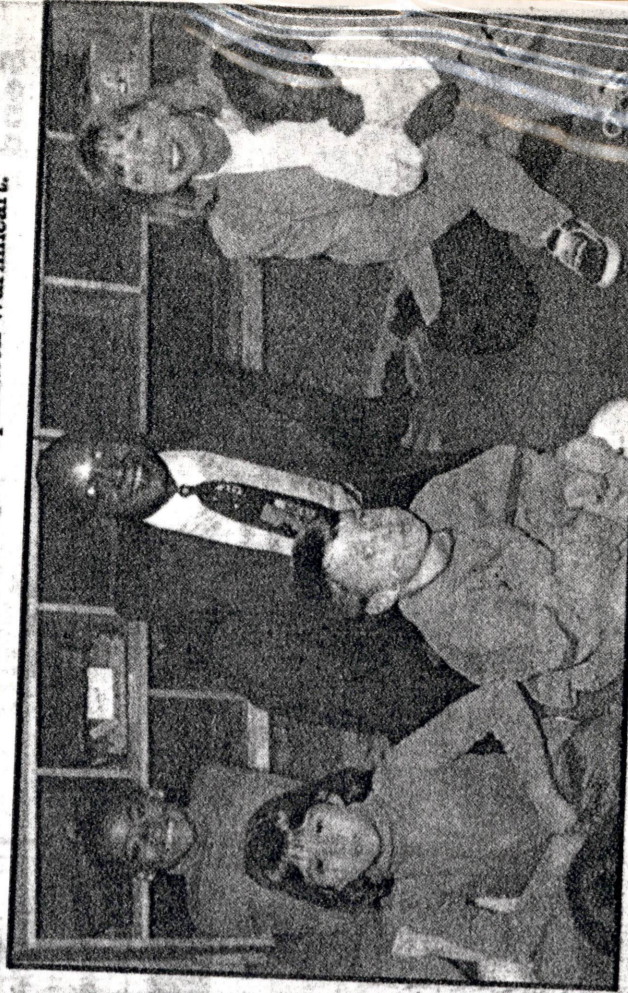
this year's campaign.
