



SUBJECT: United States Space Force (USSF) Competency Framework

- 1. The USSF is implementing the USSF Competency Framework: a new talent development model designed to complement traditional talent management processes. As stated in the Guardian Ideal, this framework will enhance selection, accession, promotion, evaluation, and talent development systems. The Competency Framework provides the means to transparently identify position requirements, define required Guardian competencies, manage talent for all Guardians (military and civilian), and establish a foundation for our future talent marketplace.
- 2. The Competency Framework represents the concepts expressed in the space capstone publication Spacepower and consists of foundational warfighting competencies (FWCs, Enclosure 1) and occupational competencies (OCs, Enclosure 2).
- a. Competencies are the knowledge, skills, abilities, and other characteristics required to perform tasks or functions to varying degrees of proficiency (Guardian Ideal, Appendix 3) while rubrics outline the proficiency levels of a competency and provide examples of observable behaviors for each proficiency level: basic, intermediate, advanced, and expert.
- b. FWCs are in alignment with the Space Force strategy and capstone doctrine. Through extensive research and participation by Guardians and career field subject matter experts (SMEs), the FWCs were approved by the Chief of Space Operations in May 2022. OCs are defined by occupational analysis (e.g., cyber operations). Through detailed work by the Air and Education & Training Command OC team and in coordination with career field managers, Guardian SMEs created a baseline of OCs.
- 3. In a phased approach throughout FY23-24, we will align FWCs and OCs to all positions, assess Guardians' competencies, and create a vetted implementation plan which includes trials within subsets of our population. In collaboration with USSF stakeholders, SF/S1 will publish guidance that incorporates the lessons from this phased approach. This inaugural Competency Framework sets the foundation for a new talent management approach and facilitates our next phase of creating the digital talent management
